1. Healing power over sickness (8:14–15)

2. Holy power over evil (8:16)

¹⁶ That evening they brought to him many who were oppressed by demons, and he cast out the spirits with a word and healed all who were sick.



3. Humble service as the Messiah (8:17)

¹⁷ This was to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah:
“He took our illnesses and bore our diseases.”



Bearing Our Sins in Isaiah 53

v. 5 he was pierced for our transgressions

v. 5 he was crushed for our iniquities

v. 6 the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all

v. 11 he shall bear their iniquities

v. 12 he bore the sin of many
